

Park Improvement Project

Update November 19th

Over the next couple of weeks the excavation of the reed bed, located to the north of the Museum, will continue, as and when the weather allows. The reed bed is a key part of the new wetland as polluted water coming into the Park will be naturally filtered and cleaned by the plants before entering the Moat and subsequently entering Yeading Brook.

The contractor, Ground Control, will also commence excavations for the realignment of Yeading Brook to the north of the cricket field. The Brook will follow a more winding path which will help to control flooding and improve the aquatic improvement as the water meanders more slowly around the curves of the new route.

Work will also continue on the new footpath through to Headstone Lane West and resurfacing of existing footpaths will commence.
