

Headstone Manor Park

Project progress report January 2020

Over the past month Ground Control, the main project Contractor, has continued to work on the creation of the sedimentation ponds and reed beds; and on World Wetlands Day, 2nd Feb, visitors to the Park had the opportunity to view the formative ponds & reed beds. This was combined with a short talk about wetlands and an explanation of how these new features will not only filter & clean the polluted water coming into the Park but will also attract lots of wildlife.

The diversion of Yeading Brook close to the Pinner View entrance is now complete, the line of the brook has been modified to create a more natural line and slow the water down in times of heavy rain. Work will now continue to landscape this area and finish footpaths around the foot bridge.

The refurbishment of the playground is well underway; this includes relocation of some of the existing equipment and the installation of new equipment including swings with cradle seats and natural log play features. The playground will be closed for several more weeks.

Works to de-culvert (open up) the Brook next to the playground are about to start and footpath diversions will be in place. Some site deliveries are expected at the Headstone Lane entrance to the Park during this part of the project and these will be planned around school drop off/ pick up times.
