

Throughout October Harrow Council has been working with Persimmon Homes regarding the site boundary of the new Harrow View West development. Persimmon Homes have carried out sheet piling works on their site to accommodate the change in level. Works on the piling are now complete



Work to improve the water quality of Yeading Brook and the Manor House Moat has started with the excavation for the new sedimentation and reed bed system. This wetland system will naturally filter pollutants and provide a very valuable new wildlife habitat increasing biodiversity whilst improving water quality. These works are a major part of the programme and are due to continue through to December 2020.



Soil from the wetland excavations will be re-used on site as much as possible to ensure a low environmental impact, and will be mounded, in keeping with the site, then seeded/planted in the coming months.



Please bear with us during this process as it can often appear muddy and visually messy, but once the works are complete we believe the new wetland and planting will be a great new addition to the park and it's users. This artist's impression provides an idea of how this new wetland will look.

An improved path network is being created throughout the park to provide new loops and make routes more accessible. Path works are being undertaken around the Bessborough Cricket Club field, and in November work will start on the link to Headstone Lane. A programme of upgrades for existing path routes will commence in early 2020 - this may cause some localised disruption as path surfaces are repaired but we will aim to minimise any access issues and will keep park users informed of path closures.

Work has been carried out to reduce the Crack Willow trees close to the playground; and investigations as to the feasibility of retaining the Weeping Willow are still being undertaken.
